**LAKE COUNTY PART-TIME EMPLOYEES
PAY RATE ORDINANCE FOR 2023**

WHEREAS, Lake County employs individuals on a part-time basis in order to provide services to the citizens of Lake County and State of Indiana; and

WHEREAS, the Lake County Council desires to establish a schedule of payment for Lake County part-time employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED BY THE LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. A part-time employee is a person who works a portion of the regular daily or monthly schedule, or is not assigned to fill a permanent position created by the Lake County Council, or State or Federal Law.

SECTION II. A part-time employee shall not work more than Twenty-nine (29) hours per week in any one or more County office or department, except as permitted by Lake County Ordinance.

SECTION III. All part-time employees not covered by the following list shall be paid a minimum rate of \$7.25 per hour, except that part-time employees designated by an individual officeholder or department head as semi-professional may be paid a maximum rate of \$8.00 per hour. The establishment of such a rate shall be at the discretion of the individual officeholder or department head, provided however, that all levels of hourly pay so established must be at fifty cent intervals, unless otherwise provided.





ORDINANCE NO. 1412C-2

ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1412C, THE ORDINANCE ALLOWING FOR THE PRE-APPROVED PAYMENT OF CLAIMS FOR LAKE COUNTY, INDIANA

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2017, the Lake County Council adopted Ordinance No. 1412C, the Ordinance Allowing for the Pre-Approved Payment of Claims for Lake County, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, the Lake County Council now desires to amend the Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

Ordinance No. 1412C, the Ordinance Allowing for the Pre-Approved Payment of Claims for Lake County, Indiana shall be amended as follows:

SECTION I. PRE-APPROVED CLAIMS.

1. Allowable Claims.

DELETE:

Notwithstanding I.C. 5-11-10, with the prior written approval of the Lake County Board of Commissioners, having jurisdiction over the allowance of claims, the County Auditor may make claim payments in advance of Board allowance for the following kinds of expenses:

- A. Property or services purchased or leased from the United States Government, its agencies, or its political subdivision;
- B. License or permit fees;
- C. Insurance premiums;
- D. Utility payments or utility connection charges;
- E. General grant programs where advance funding is not prohibited and the contracting party posts sufficient security to cover the amount advanced;
- F. Grants of State funds authorized by statute;
- G. Maintenance agreements and service agreements that have been approved and signed at a meeting of the Board of Commissioners including contracts for Consulting, Legal Services, Professional Services, Proposals and Bids;
- H. Leases or rental agreements;
- I. Bond or coupon payments;
- J. Payroll;
- K. State or federal taxes;
- L. Expenses that must be paid because of emergency circumstances;
- M. Expenses described in an Ordinance and duly adopted by the County Council;
- N. Postage, advertising, dues and subscriptions;
- O. Property rental, official's bonds and court judgments;
- P. Employee reimbursements for travel, i.e., mileage, meals, lodging and conference fees.

INSERT:

Notwithstanding I.C. 5-11-10, with the prior written approval of the Lake County Board of Commissioners, having jurisdiction over the allowance of claims, the County Auditor may make claim payments in advance of Board allowance for the following kinds of expenses:

- A. Property or services purchased or leased from the United States Government, its agencies, or its political subdivision;
- B. License or permit fees;
- C. Insurance premiums;
- D. Utility payments or utility connection charges;
- E. General grant programs where advance funding is not prohibited and the contracting party posts sufficient security to cover the amount advanced;
- F. Grants of State funds authorized by statute;
- G. Maintenance agreements and service agreements that have been approved and signed at a meeting of the Board of Commissioners including contracts for Consulting, Legal Services, Professional Services, Proposals and Bids;
- H. Leases or rental agreements;
- I. Bond or coupon payments;
- J. Payroll;
- K. State or federal taxes;
- L. Expenses that must be paid because of emergency circumstances;
- M. Expenses described in an Ordinance and duly adopted by the County Council;
- N. Postage, advertising, dues and subscriptions;
- O. Property rental, official's bonds and court judgments;
- P. Employee reimbursements for departmental use for incidental and emergency small-dollar purchases where the use of alternative means (Purchase order) is not feasible. Incidental supplies needed for department operations, training, dues, professional license and subscription. Necessary and reasonable food (e.g., sandwiches and beverages) brought into the office for business meetings and juror meals. In general, departments are strongly encouraged to use the Lake County Procurement procedure and:

Cash purchases for items considered non-essential for the department or unit to perform its mission shall not be reimbursed. If an item is determined to be non-essential, the unit employee who made the purchase must incur the costs involved.

Requests for reimbursement of travel related expenses should be within five days of return but no longer than 30 days after return. Requests for reimbursement of non-travel related expenses must be requested within 60 days of when the expenses were paid or incurred.

Expenditures may not be used to circumvent current purchasing procedures.








Approver: Upon submission, Expense Reimbursements are first viewed by the Approver. Approvers are responsible for reviewing supporting documentation, reviewing Expense Reimbursements for policy compliance,

and reviewing funding being charged.

Auditor: Expense Reimbursements are reviewed by an Auditor after the Approver. Auditors are responsible for reviewing Expense Reimbursements for policy compliance

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-3.5-5, the County Council shall adopt ordinances to promote efficient County Government; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-5-2(b), the County Council shall appropriate money to be paid out of the County Treasury, and money may be paid from the County Treasury only under appropriation made by the County Council, except as otherwise provided as law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-1-8-4, the Lake County Council may by ordinance or resolution transfer money from one fund to another; and

WHEREAS, the Lake County Council desires to establish by ordinance all funds within the County Treasury, from which appropriations and transfers require County Council approval; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-24-6.4(a) when real property is sold, the purchaser at the sale shall immediately pay the amount of the bid to the County Treasurer; the County Treasurer shall apply the payment in the following manner: (1) first, to the taxes, special assessments, penalties, and costs described in I.C. 6-1.1-24-5(e); (2) second, to other delinquent property taxes in the manner provided in I.C. 6-1.1-23-5(b) and (3) Third, to a separate “tax sale surplus fund”; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-24-6.4, notwithstanding the other provisions of I.C. 6-1.1-26, et seq., the County Treasurer shall place the portion of a tax or special assessment payment which exceeds the amount actually due, as shown by the tax duplicate or special assessments records, in a special fund to be known as the “Auditor’s County Commissioners Property Tax Sale Surplus Fund”, a non-reverting fund (Fund). Amounts placed in the Fund shall first be applied to the taxpayer’s delinquent taxes in the manner provided in I.C. 6-1.1-23-5(b). The taxpayer may then file a verified claim for money remaining in the surplus tax fund; and



WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-24-6.4(d) if an excess payment is not claimed within the three (3) year period after November 10th of the year in which the payment was made and the County Treasurer has given the written notice required under I.C. 6-1.1-26-6(d), the County Auditor shall transfer the excess from the Auditor’s County Commissioners Property Tax Sale Surplus Fund into the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-24-6.4(d), the Lake County Council desires to establish the Auditor’s County Commissioners Property Tax Sale Surplus Fund, a non-reverting Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Lake County Council now establishes the Auditor's County Commissioners Property Tax Sale Surplus Fund, a Non-Reverting Fund, for the distribution of any surplus generated by a County Commissioner Tax Certificate Sale.
2. The County Treasurer shall place the portion of a tax or special assessment payment which exceeds the amount actually due, as shown by the tax duplicate or special assessments records, in the "Auditor's County Commissioners Property Tax Sale Surplus Fund", a non-reverting fund; amounts placed in the Fund shall first be applied to the taxpayer's delinquent taxes in the manner provided in I.C. 6-1.1-24-6.4(a) and (b).
3. That pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-24-7(c) a claim for money deposited in the Fund can be made and if approved by the Auditor and Treasurer, the Auditor shall issue a warrant to the claimant for the amount due.
4. Unless the redemption period specified under I.C. 6-1.1-25 has been extended under federal bankruptcy law, an amount deposited in the Auditor's County Commissioners Property Tax Sale Surplus Fund shall be transferred by the Auditor to the County General Fund and may not be disbursed under I.C. 6-1.1-24-6.4(d) if it is not claimed within the three (3) year period after the date of its receipt.
5. Any money remaining in the Fund at the end of the year shall not revert to the General Fund but continue in the Auditor's County Commissioners Property Tax Sale Surplus Fund, subject to appropriation by the Lake County Council, or as otherwise provided by law.





WHEREAS, a winning bidder must pay all costs pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-24-2(b)(3); and

WHEREAS, the Lake County Council desires to establish the Auditor’s Property Sale Fund for Commissioners’ Tax Sale Certificates, Fund No. 385, a Non-Reverting Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:


1. That the Auditor’s Property Sale Fund for Commissioners’ Tax Sale Certificates, Fund No. 385, a non-reverting Fund, shall be

established as an Auditor's working fund from which are paid the expenses from the Commissioners' Tax Sale. The Fund shall act as a clearing house for the sales proceeds that are due to the taxing units where the property is located, minus administration expenses which are determined and documented.


2. The proceeds of the Commissioners' Tax Sale shall be distributed and expenses paid as follows:
 - (a) First, the costs to the County Executive directly attributable to the sale of a certificate of sale shall be paid;
 - (b) Second, the balance shall be applied as follows:
 - (i) the delinquent taxes and special assessments on each tract or item of real property;
 - (ii) the taxes and special assessments on each tract of real property that are due and payable in the year of the sale, regarding of whether the taxes and special assessments are delinquent; all penalties which are due on the delinquencies;
 - (c) Third, the balance applied to taxes and special assessments, shall be distributed to the units at the time of the second distribution to unit as follows:
 - (i) The funds shall be distributed to the units in which the property sold at the Commissioners Tax Certificate Sale is located.
 - (ii) Each political unit in which the property is located shall receive a percentage distribution based upon the percent of the tax bill that it would have received if the property owner had paid the tax bills due and owing for the tax year that immediately proceeded the Commissioners Tax Certificate Sale where the property was sold.

That this Ordinance rescinds and repeals Ordinance No. 1264E and Ordinance No. 1427E.




